" It's Friday, But Sunday's Comin' "

▼ ven though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me" (Psalms 23:4 NIV)

How deep, and how dark, is the valley you are in today?

Are you weighed down by the burden of your circumstances? Do you spend hour after useless hour wishing that things were different? Are you depressed because you have no power to change things? Do you feel you are a victim of "the system," or "bad luck," or other people's malice?

Or are you sometimes overcome by the awful realization of your own guilt? Your history of broken promises, wasted opportunities, secret and confessed sins, strained and broken relationships? Are your failures due largely to your own self-indulgence, laziness, and foolishness?


Jesus was in a deep, dark valley, during those days before He died. He knew all about what was coming, and it was awful. Even worse, He didn't deserve any of it. If ever there was an innocent man, Jesus was that man.

Imagine sitting on Death Row, waiting for the final day of your life. Then imagine that you are Jesus, also watching the day of your death approaching, knowing you have to suffer, not just death, but the most terrible, agonizing, shameful death that human beings had so far been able to invent.

Imagine your friends, who have sworn to support you no matter what, abandoning you like rats leaving a sinking ship. Imagine being thrown into a deep dungeon for hours, then dragged before a kangaroo court that is just looking for any

excuse to convict you.

Imagine being beaten with a whip that has little pieces of bone and rock and metal fastened along the length of its cords. A whip that cuts to the bone with every blow, and can literally strip all the flesh from a man's back.



Imagine having men hit you in the face, and spit in your face, and yank out your hair and your beard. Imagine having a crown of sharp thorns forced onto your head-the pain of it, and the blood from a dozen scalp wounds blinding your eyes. Imagine being mocked, laughed at, and knocked down more than once.

Imagine being dragged before Pilate—a scheming politician who will set you free if you say the right words; but you don't want to be freed, you want to do the Father's will, even now.

Imagine being forced to carry a heavy

timber, and falling under its weight because you are so weakened that you can hardly stand. Imagine being dragged that infamous hill execution, being stripped naked, and thrown to the ground. Picture the spikes being hammered through your wrists and your feet, and feel the wrenching agony as the cross is lifted and dropped into its socket in the rock.



And it's not over. Not yet. Your body still wants to live. You have to struggle to lift yourself up, against the agony in your wrists and feet, and the rasp of the rough wood on your raw back, over and over again, just to take the next desperate breath.

Why dwell on the details of the crucifixion? Because it's important to understand what Jesus went through for you and me. The pictures of the white-robed Christ hanging on a golden cross, with a wistful look on his beautiful face, are ridiculous. He was not beautiful as He died. He was so horrible to look at that most of us would turn away and vomit if we saw Him.

And then He died. And what did He suffer after He died? St. Paul said, in the letter to the



Ephesian Christians, that Jesus descended into Hell. Did He go there as Conqueror, to set some of the captives free, as many believe? Or did He suffer there the pain of <u>our</u> eternal punishment?

At any rate, Jesus had to go through with it. If He had not suffered for your sins (and for mine!), you and I would have had to suffer our terrible punishment ourselves. To be without God forever, totally lost in eternal, lonely, burning darkness, beyond all hope and all help, and to know it is deserved. If the horror of that punishment is not real to you, you need to read the "Hell" passages of the Bible and meditate on them. We need to understand what we have been spared. And we need to know what those without Christ are doomed to suffer, so that we will feel some urgency about sharing Christ with the lost.

So that was Friday, the day the Savior of the world died.

What about His companions? The twelve disciples, and the other men and women who were His friends and followers. What were they doing on Friday and Saturday?

The Bible clearly shows that the others were in the depths of despair. The disciples, all except John, had already run away to hide. Peter denied Jesus three times, cursing and swearing he "did not know the man." Joseph of Arimathea courageously asked Pilate for His body, and got permission to take it. The women, strong in the face of disaster as women usually are, sadly prepared His body for burial. And then they all hid out, "for fear of the Jews," and mourned His loss.

Judas Iscariot, sick with horror at the outcome of his treachery, threw away his blood money and went and hanged himself.

<u>Friday, Jesus died</u>. Saturday, he was dead.

If that were the end of the story, this world would be a hopeless place. Those who had ever heard of Jesus of Nazareth would be few; those who actually followed Him would be pathetic.

The Resurrection of Christ brought on a whole range of emotions in His followers. First there was disbelief. All of them knew for certain He was dead. A few of them had <u>seen</u> Him die.

Next came hope. "Can it be

true? Do we dare to believe it?" Then came the joy of knowing He actually lived again, and the thrill of seeing Him among them. What joy, to know that He was truly the Messiah; that He was Victor over death and the grave! To believe, and finally to begin to understand, all that He had been teaching them.

And that is still not the end of the story. His followers "hung out" in Jerusalem, waiting, as He had commanded, to be filled with "power from on high."

And it happened. On the day of Pentecost, as they were gathered together and worshiping the Lord, fire fell from the sky, the tongues of flame came down and rested on them, and they were <u>baptized</u>—<u>filled</u>—with the Spirit of the Living God.

And Peter stands up immediately and preaches what may be the most powerful sermon ever preached!

People have tried to explain away Christ's death and Resurrection, but there is no other way to account for the transformation of that huddled bunch of timid, defeated Jesus-followers into the dynamic, power-filled New Testament Church that "turned the world upside down."

Jesus did what He said He would do. He was put to death, and on the third day He rose from the dead. He touched the disciples and gave them <u>fire power</u>, as He promised. He kept His promises.

And He still does.

Are you in a tough place today? Is it "Friday" for you? Or maybe "Thursday," because you expect things will be worse tomorrow? Or maybe it's "Saturday," and you consider yourself as good as dead?

Think of Jesus, and what He suffered for you. Things could be a lot worse—you could be lost. You <u>would</u> be lost, without Him.

Think of Paul—of the whippings he endured; of all the times he was thrown into jail. He could do "all things" because Jesus gave him strength. That same strength is yours for the asking. Ask for it, and receive it by faith.

Today may be your Friday—or Thursday, or Saturday—but your Sunday is comin', if you want it to. You don't have to overcome death—Jesus has done it all. Rest in Him—in the knowledge of His victory, and His love for you.
