

# **Dependency and Obligation**

Several years ago I went through an "episode" that put me in the hospital for four days. I feel fortunate that some good, rather than a lot of bad, came from it. But while I was going through that experience I did some thinking, and I'd like to share my thoughts with you.

As I thought of my situation, I began to understand in a new way how very easy it is for something to come along and turn my world upside down. A very little thing—a blockage



in my small intestine—resulted in three days of serious pain, plus the need to totally abandon any plan that I might have had for those three days and two more. I know, that's trivial compared to what many people are suffering — more about that later. What struck me, though, was how



utterly dependent we all are on God's provision. He is the one who gives us each breath we breathe, never mind the health we take for granted. If He allows that provision to slip for a moment, whatever the reason, we find ourselves in deep

trouble. As long as He sustains me I can keep going; if He quits, I'm a dead duck.

Aren't we blessed, then, to have a God who loves us? A God who created us and who continues to love us wholeheartedly even when we ignore Him or despise His purposes? A God who gives us life and health and strength to carry on; and if we have to struggle, a God who goes with us through the struggle to help us endure and conquer it?

God says to us, as His greatest commandment, "Love Me," and of course that also implies, "Trust Me." Well, besides the fact that He commands it, why should we do that? The answer that I keep coming up with is that it lowers our resistance to

the guidance and benefits and blessings He wants to give us. You see, He gives us the freedom to resist Him; and even to rebel against Him. When we lower our guard and accept His will for our lives; when we say, "Lord, You are worthy, You are beautiful, and I love You," and we truly mean it, then God can really work in our lives.

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11) This is what God says to the children of Israel, and we can be confident that He says the very same thing to us, because His revealed plan includes us all.

We need to acknowledge Who God is, and recognize our total dependence upon His loving mercy. We need to thank Him, surrender our will to His, and do our best to cooperate with His purposes. Only then can we move into the full measure of the sonship He has planned for us.

A second thing I began to understand is that whenever we are afflicted, this gives us an opportunity — no, more than that, it presents an

actual obligation — to pray for others who have the same affliction. If I am in the hospital, suffering whatever level of pain, I can and must offer prayers to God for those people who are going through similar



suffering or worse. If you are in prison, you can and must offer prayers for those who are imprisoned. Some are in jail cells like you who are inmates; others are housebound or wheelchair-bound or confined to bed because of illness or infirmity — you, in your very real distress in prison, can have sympathy for others, and can ask God to give them comfort and help.

It's important, too, to pray like you mean it. Don't just say words; tell God (and yourself) that you really care about the people for whom you are praying. Think about them; imagine yourself in their circumstances, and <u>care</u>.

Does this accomplish anything? The only answer we can give is, "God knows." But His word tells us to "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians



5:17); it tells us to "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2); it tells us that God "comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble

with the comfort we ourselves have received from God." (2 Corinthians 1:4) I am convinced that no heartfelt prayer that is made in a spirit of love and compassion will go unheard, and that, even if the prayer is not in agreement with God's current purposes, it still is a worthwhile effort.

I know that the prayers of fellow believers resulted in strength and comfort for me as I went through my illness, and I really felt that I needed to pass that comfort on by praying for others in similar situations. As if to underscore this thought, a neighbor and friend of mine was admitted to the hospital while I was there, and he endured suffering far longer with that awful tube down his throat than I had to. How could I have not kept him in my prayers?

That period of hospitalization gave me a real appreciation for the pains that others are suffering. My hospital roommate, who was my age, had had a stroke and was unable even to sit up without some help. What were my troubles compared to his? Not even worth mentioning.

Inmates, think about your own situation, behind bars. I have not been in that situation, but I know it must be hard to bear. But



now think of the families who just this year have lost their homes and all of their possessions to war or hurricanes or wildfires. Think of those who have lost loved ones to the coronavirus pandemic. Think of people who are hurting badly,

and pray for them. I don't know how your prayers will help them, but I believe that they will.

These are the thoughts I brought home from that time in the hospital: we are utterly dependent upon God's grace every minute of our lives; and we have a sacred duty to pray for others, especially those suffering the things we have suffered and worse.

Let's review what God has done for us:

- He created each of us, with love.
- He sustains us each minute through life.
- He sent His only Son to die for our sins.
- He sends His Holy Spirit to guide and empower us to live as He asks us to live.
- He has given us His word to be our guide.
- He gives us the love of others in Christian fellowship. How precious that has been to me, especially during that time of illness.
- He promises us joy forever with Him in eternity.

I hope this has been a helpful message for many of you. Think it over, and see if you find yourself agreeing with me. I bid you God's Peace and Joy, whatever your circumstances. His love is by far the greatest gift we could ever receive or desire.

I'm sorry, but I do not have any Bibles or study materials to send to inmates. The latest information I have about sources is not very current, but I'm including it on Page 3.


